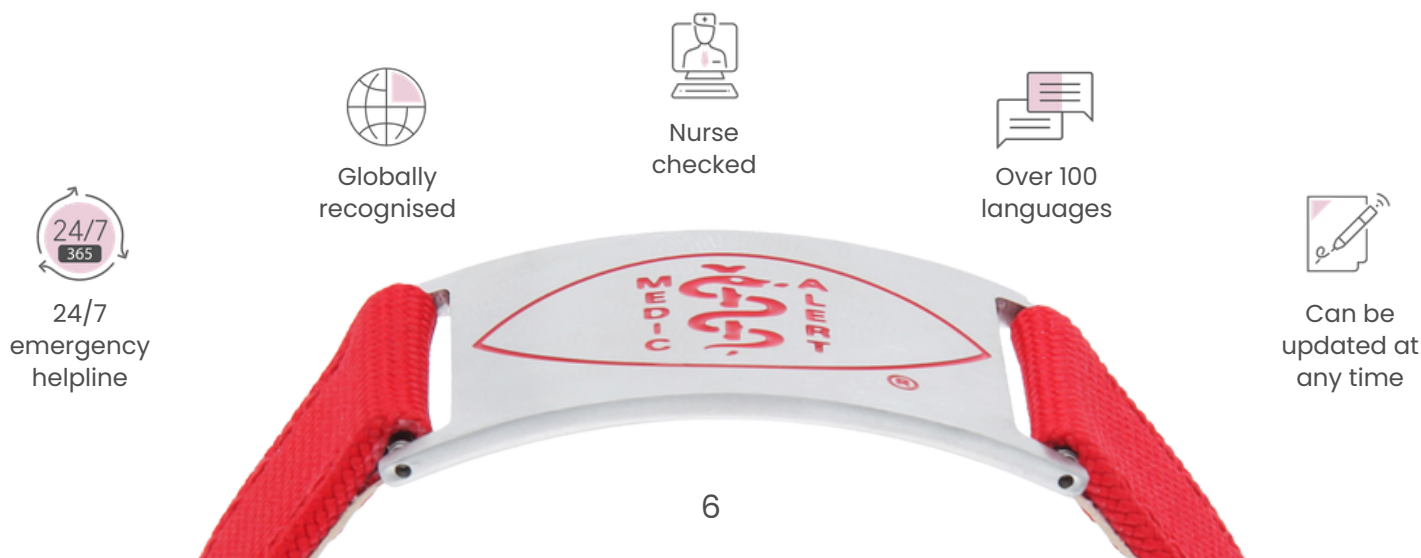

MedicAlert currently has nine Trustees, including the Chair, and one Trustee designate who is beginning their first term in September 2026. To ensure continuity of expertise essential to our work, we are seeking to appoint a Trustee with first-responder or emergency medicine experience or expertise to align with an upcoming term of office completion.

Our Board culture is positive and flexible, and we are deeply appreciative of the commitment and expertise of its volunteers. Looking ahead, our ambitions are bold. We are focused on broadening representation, sustaining active engagement, and raising the visibility of the organisation across the sector and beyond.

Role Description

Role Title: Trustee / Non-Executive Director

As a Board member, you will lead MedicAlert Foundation UK to advance its mission, enhance and expand its services and ensure the charity's long-term sustainability, enabling us to support the greatest possible number of people in need.

Key responsibilities and duties:

Strategic Leadership

- Provide vision, direction and leadership to advance the charity's mission and uphold its values.
- Support and challenge the management team to achieve agreed goals and objectives.

Ethics

- Uphold the highest levels of integrity, financial stewardship and governance.
- Model ethical decision-making and behaviour.

Strategic direction

- Shape and influence the organisation's strategic direction to ensure alignment with its mission and long-term goals,

Accountability, Compliance and Oversight

- Ensure the charity fulfills its charitable purpose and complies with all legal and regulatory requirements.
- Ensure transparency and compliance with relevant laws, regulations and best practices.
- Ensure that the charity pays due and meaningful regard to safeguarding through supporting the oversight of the charity's duty of care to staff, volunteers and the people we support.
- Ensure the charity protects the privacy of all stakeholders, including compliance with data protection laws and GDPR.
- Safeguard the organisation's assets and reputation through effective risk management and oversight.
- Regularly review governance policies and procedures.

Terms Of Office

Trustees are appointed on a voluntary basis for a 3-year term, with the option to extend this for one further 3-year term. All new Trustees will receive:

- A full Board of Trustees induction, with specific training provided.
- Support in completing Information Governance (IG) training.
- Reimbursement of out-of-pocket expenses.
- Personal development opportunities, where possible, to enhance existing and develop new skills.
- Opportunities to connect with like-minded individuals who share a commitment to MedicAlert's mission.

Time Commitment

In addition to your general responsibilities, you will also be required to serve on committees created by the Board.

- 4 Board meetings annually (approximately 3-4 hours plus reading time for each meeting).
- You will be asked to sit on one or more Board committees – 3 or 4 meetings for each Board committee annually (approximately 2 hours plus reading time for each meeting).
- 1 trustee strategy meeting and dinner (full day plus meal and overnight stay).
- You may also be required to attend conferences or act in an ambassadorial role on behalf of MedicAlert.
- Training and development needs will be discussed at yearly appraisals and may require additional time beyond the previously agreed commitment.
